As part of 4-H's involvement with the Let's Move campaign, 4-H National Headquarters has started a group to take the President's Challenge together - and you're invited to be part of it!

The President's Challenge is for one million Americans to complete the Presidential Active Lifestyle Award (PALA). 4-H is answering this call by setting a goal with Michelle Obama to have 100,000 4-H members and their families complete their PALA.

The Presidential Active Lifestyle Award recognizes those individuals who log their recommended physical activity for six consecutive weeks, five days a week (60 minutes for youth, 30 minutes minimum for adults).

Through this first-hand experience they gain a deeper understanding of another culture and gain insight into the values and lifestyle of their own family and community.
