YOU'RE INVITED TO JOIN 4-H IN ANSWERING THE PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE!

As part of 4-H's involvement with the Let's Move campaign, 4-H National Headquarters has started a group to take the President's Challenge together - and you're invited to be part of it!

The President's Challenge is for one million Americans to complete the Presidential Active Lifestyle Award (PALA). 4-H is answering this call by setting a goal with Michelle Obama to have 100,000 4-H members and their families complete their PALA.

The Presidential Active Lifestyle Award recognizes those individuals who log their recommended physical activity for six consecutive weeks, five days a week (60 minutes for youth, 30 minutes minimum for adults).

Signing up for the 4-H group is simple. All you have to do is register. It's quick, and there's no cost to participate!

HOW TO JOIN -----

- 1) Go to <https://www.presidentschallenge.org/account/register.php>
- 2) Fill out the registration form.
- 3) When you arrive at your personal dashboard page, click on the groups tab and join the 4-H group.
 - Your Group ID Number: **96548**
 - Your Group Name: **National 4-H Program**
- 4) After registering, start logging your activities. As you log activities you'll be able to track your progress toward winning a President's Challenge Award or Medal.

HORSE CAMP

We have a confirmed date for our 2011 Horse Camp for Riverside and San Bernardino Counties!!! **The dates are June 19th through the 23rd and it will be held at the LA County Fairgrounds.** We need at least 35 campers to break even so please make sure to send in all paper work on time this year. We had to cancel last year because we didn't have enough campers to break even. Please ask around to see if anybody is willing to sponsor the camp so if we can't come up with the minimum number of campers we can still hold camp and not have to cancel again this year.

The cost will be \$165.00 per camper, \$50.00 for each additional horse, and \$85 for the horseless camper. Chaperones are \$50.00 and there must be one chaperone per 5 kids.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

California 4-H is looking for families who would like to host an international student in their home for one month this summer. The international students range in age from 12 and 19 and come from Costa Rica, Japan, and Norway.

Applications are being accepted now. Students are placed in homes with a youth of the same gender and within two years of age. The application provides information to help ensure good placements with families and teens sharing common interests.

You don't need a fancy home or a separate bedroom to host – just a desire to make room in your lives for a new friend. And you don't need to spend a lot of money or time traveling the state – the students are not here as tourists. They are here to live with your family and participate in your normal summer activities. The costs are minimal. The students come with their own spending money and medical insurance.

Please consider offering this priceless educational experience to your family. Teens that participate in exchange opportunities are better prepared for life in a global society. Through this first-hand experience they gain a deeper understanding of another culture and gain insight into the values and lifestyle of their own family and community.
